A Wonderful Winter

First Impression

The year kicked off with a First Impression event, which is our program that pairs students with the business attire they need to take the next step in life. Partnering with the Georgia State University School of Law and Year Up, Caring For Others provided suits, slacks, skirts, blouses and accessories to Atlanta men and women on the verge of professional life.

New Board Members

We welcomed new board members at our annual swearing-in ceremony. Judge Shondeana Morris presided over the procedure as we welcomed new faces and delighted in returning members. Joseph Northington agreed to stay on as Chairman and Crystal Khalil as Vice Chairwoman.

International Poverty Forum

The same month, Caring For Others hosted its first International Poverty Forum (IPF). We are passionate about breaking the cycle of poverty and have worked to give a voice to those who are struggling with its torment. As such, we convened the IPF and invited a diverse group of thought leaders from the private, public and nonprofit sectors to turn ideas into action. Out of the IPF, each member organization was charged with implementing specific objectives during 2018.

A Splendid Spring

Feeding Atlanta Communities

In March, Caring For Others was busy at home in Atlanta and abroad. Our annual Feeding Atlanta Communities food distribution served nearly 1,500 local households in one day. Through our “mobile pantry” format, our volunteers gave out thousands of pounds of fresh meats, eggs, vegetables and fruits, as well as canned goods to participants who appreciated the ease of this drive-through distribution.

Antigua

The following month, Caring For Others President & CEO Eslene Richmond-Shockley and Board Vice Chairwoman Crystal Khalil visited the island of Antigua and executed a house-to-house distribution to local families, including many who had been displaced from Barbuda by the 2017 hurricanes. Hundreds of families were helped during the weeklong visit, which brought the blight of poverty into sharp focus.

A Super Summer

Mobile Pantry

We launched summer with a Mobile Pantry distribution to seniors in June. By the end of summer, we had already distributed more than 400,000 pounds of food via the Mobile Pantry program!



Summer Street Basketball

In 2018, our Summer Street Basketball program reached new heights. During June and July, we welcomed local kids for afternoons on the court set up in the Caring For Others parking lot. In addition to shooting hoops and playing pick-up, the children received a hearty snack and mentorship from our staff and local police officers who partnered with us on this effort.



No Bare Soles

The annual No Bare Soles distribution provided footwear, back-to-school supplies and clothing to children in July. In Atlanta, we gave out new sneakers, jeans, jackets, socks, shirts, backpacks, and more. The reach of No Bare Soles also extended outside of our community, helping more than 1,700 children in all.



NOBLE

We teamed up with NOBLE (National Organization of Black Law Enforcement Executives) to visit Concord, Georgia, in Pike County, a town with just a few hundred residents, many living below the poverty level. During our visit, we provided a dozen families with mattresses and gave food, clothing, and 200 pairs of shoes to the children.

Community Service Award

In July, we were excited when Caring For Others President & CEO Mrs. Eslene Richmond-Shockley received the Walter Lawson Community Service Award from NOBLE. The award, which is donated each year by Motorola to a person who has made significant contributions to his or her community, was presented at the organization's annual leadership conference.



Art of Caring Reception and Fete

A Fantastic Fall

Art of Caring Reception & Fete

The fall season meant that it was time for our annual Art of Caring Reception & Fete. At this fundraising event, Caring For Others was joined by 200 international dignitaries, donors, and supporters to celebrate our mission and sustain our core programs to eradicate poverty at home and around the world. Guests enjoyed a global dinner catered by Soirée, a program featuring emcee Fred Blankenship from WSB-TV, live music from Jabari and plenty of dancing. Caring For Others is grateful to our major sponsors for the 2018 event - Global Payments and Delta Air Lines.

Community Harvest Distribution

Each fall, we host the Community Harvest Distribution, and for 2018, we were pleased to provide 300 seniors with Thanksgiving baskets. Our 18th-annual Thanksgiving food distribution included fresh turkeys, lots of fresh vegetables, stuffing, canned goods and plenty of smiles.



DISASTER RELIEF

The 2018 hurricane season would not leave us in peace. From September through December, Caring For Others participated in multiple joint relief distributions to victims of Hurricanes Florence and Michael.

Convoy of Care

In September we partnered with WSB-TV, NOBLE, Georgia law enforcement agencies and trucking companies to produce a Convoy of Care to collect and bring supplies to those whose well-being had been affected by Hurricane Florence. In total, 18 semi-trucks filled with clothing, supplies and donated items were delivered to communities in North and South Carolina, as well as Albany, Georgia.

Hurricane Florence Relief

In November, Caring For Others,

Delivering Good Inc. and NOBLE, in partnership with the Mayor and Chief of Police of Fayetteville, North Carolina, brought 10 semi-truckloads of supplies to families in Fayetteville. The trucks carried much-needed items, such as apparel, undergarments, shoes and more to help families rebuild after the effects of Hurricane Florence. The one-day, pop-up event served 10,000 individuals.

Hurricane Michael Relief

In December, Caring For Others again partnered with Delivering Good and NOBLE to help Florida Panhandle residents. Several months after Hurricane Michael, these victims of were still struggling with the devastation the storm had caused. In addition to supplies, we distributed Walmart gift cards just in time for the holidays.




Guyana

Caring For Others thanks the hundreds of donors and volunteers who helped make all of this service possible. We would not be heading towards our 20th anniversary without you!




